Worship Education for the Week

Here at Friendship Missionary Baptist Church during our “fellowship time” we often sing a song that may not be familiar to some. It’s titled “**KOINONIA**” written by V. Michael McKay (#579 in our Hymnal)

"What is koinonia?"

Koinonia is a Greek word that occurs 20 times in the Bible. *Koinonia*’s primary meaning is “fellowship, sharing in common, communion.” The first occurrence of *koinonia* is [Acts 2:42](#), “They devoted themselves to the apostles’ teaching and to the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer.” Christian fellowship is a key aspect of the Christian life. Believers in Christ are to come together in love, faith, and encouragement. That is the essence of *koinonia*.

A powerful example of what *koinonia* should look like can be found in a study of the phrase “one another” in the Bible. Scripture commands us to be devoted to one another ([Romans 12:10](#)), honor one another ([Romans 12:10](#)), live in harmony with one another ([Romans 12:16](#); [1 Peter 3:8](#)), accept one another ([Romans 15:7](#)), serve one another in love ([Galatians 5:13](#)), be kind and compassionate to one another ([Ephesians 4:32](#)), admonish one another ([Colossians 3:16](#)), encourage one another ([1 Thessalonians 5:11](#); [Hebrews 3:13](#)), spur one another on toward love and good deeds ([Hebrews 10:24](#)), offer hospitality ([1 Peter 4:9](#)), and love one another ([1 Peter 1:22](#); [1 John 3:11](#); [3:23](#); [4:7](#); [4:11-12](#)).

If you are unfamiliar with the words to our *koinonia* song, please take the time to study them and join in singing with us as we fellowship one with another.

Mon.	Jeremiah 32:1-5	Jeremiah’s prophecy while entrapped in jail.
Tues.	Jeremiah 32:6-16	God’s word revealed to Jeremiah confirmed and fulfilled.
Wed.	Jeremiah 32:16-19	The prophet’s prayer to God.
Thurs.	Jeremiah 32:20-25	The prophet reminds God of his past works.
Fri.	Jeremiah 32:26-35	Stay alert! I am God, the God of everything living. Is there anything I can’t do?
Sat.	Jeremiah 32:36-44	God’s promised agreement to His people.

Points to Ponder: *In the Old Testament, the God of love is also depicted as a God of wrath and judgment, but we must understand God is also a God of hope and mercy. God gives us a heart to fear (honor, reverence) Him, and as Christians, God creates in us a spirit of love for our brothers and sisters. Through our prayers, we discern and acknowledge that we can trust God because He is faithful and constant in His relationship with us. When we are fearful, God is faithful. When we feel far from God, He is ever present. No matter the challenges and obstacles of life, be assured that God’s promises to His people are true.*

Prayer: *Lord, we know that You have our best interest at heart, as a good father and shepherd does. As we go from day to day, help us to trust You more and not merely leaning on our own beliefs. You have been the God of all creation and still remain the God of all who live! Christian and non-Christian alike, every knee must bow and every tongue confess that You are Lord! We trust You as Good Shepherd! Amen.*
