Action – Energized, alert, ready and mobilized for engagement

During this season of Advent, we are more aware of, and wait with great anticipation the coming of the Christ child. Many of our **actions** centering on the Advent wreath, energize gathered congregations, waiting with great hope, joy, faith and love for the celebration of the birth of Jesus. Many children have advent calendars and count down the days to December 25, not only because of the anticipated toys and gifts under a Christmas tree, but in celebration of the coming of Jesus, the Incarnate One – Jesus in the form of humankind, yet wholly divine. The prophet Isaiah, with great expectancy foretells in Isaiah 9:6 “*For unto us a child is born, unto us a son is given: and the government shall be upon his shoulder: and his name shall be called Wonderful, Counsellor, The mighty God, The everlasting Father, The Prince of Peace.*” (KJV)

On the third Sunday of each month, we have Baby Blessing and Dedication, an **action** that causes parents, family and friends to wait with great anticipation, as the children God has blessed our church family with are blessed and dedicated back to Him. During this time of blessing and dedication, we, the church congregation, should prepare to take **action** and become an integral part of the life/lives of the babies that God has blessed to be among us. Maybe you are asking how can you be a part of a child’s life, when you do not know their parents, grandparents or any other family member. The answer is simple. When we take **action** – are energized, alert, ready and mobilized for engagement, we influence the lives of those connected to us in the church, the community and the world. The **action** of using the gifts, talents and abilities that God has given us, via the Holy Spirit transforms us from strangers into teachers, encouragers, helpers, servers, evangelists, preachers, pastors and mercifully compassionate servants of God, for the children in our congregation, the community and the world.

During this season of expectancy and giving, let your **actions** mobilize you for engagement. Give the gift of time. Take the **action** necessary to give time back to God, as you develop stronger spiritual disciplines. Take the necessary **action** to give the gift of time to a child in school who needs tutoring, mentoring, or encouragement. Take the time to give to someone you do not know; take an angel from the angel tree, adopt a family for this sacred season. Take **action** – be energized, alert, ready and mobilized for engagement in your spiritual life and development, it will help equip you for service in the kingdom of God. Take **action**, so the lives of those you love, and the lives of those who desperately need you, not because of the anticipated beautifully wrapped package, but also for the wonderful spiritual gifts that God has placed in you for this season, and for the edification of the church.

Increasing Your Knowledge of Christianity and Spirituality

The word literacy, which is defined as the ability to read, write and compute or as the condition or quality of being knowledgeable in a particular subject or field, is applied to many aspects of life. We speak of computer literacy, consumer literacy, cultural literacy, health literacy, social literacy and even technological literacy. Being literate in these areas helps us increase our physical, mental, social and cultural development or well-being in this modern society. However, we rarely speak about spiritual literacy, which is being educated about Christianity and our spirituality. Becoming spiritually literate will help us find the sacred in every day life, teach others about God’s word and stand strong in our faith during challenging times.

December is designated as Spiritual Literacy Month. This month provides an opportunity for us to focus intently on how we can increase our knowledge of Christian doctrine, scripture, prayer, spiritual gifts, church history, evangelism, ethics and theology. We can educate ourselves on these topics in various ways that fit our individual learning styles and meet our individual needs. Christian books, CDs, DVDs, workshops and seminars as well as Bible studies and even the internet are valuable resources. However, be sure that the authors, workshop leaders and websites are credible.

As you think of the perfect gift for friends and family during Christmas and Kwanzaa, consider giving gifts of age-appropriate Bibles, study Bibles, devotional books, CDs, and DVDs to help them increase their spiritual literacy. Since Advent marks the start of the Christian (liturgical) year, now is an excellent time to make a commitment to your spiritual development and the spiritual development of those you know and love throughout the year.
